Courses Leading to Qualifications

Art and Design Level 1 (NCFE)

This course allows learners to plan, produce and reflect upon their own art and design work. It would be useful for anyone wishing to improve their art and design skills for creative employment or higher level art courses. Students will explore a variety of materials, media and techniques and present selected work for display and assessment. No experience required. *Tutor: Beverley Nel*

English Level 2 – Functional Skills (OCR)

A fantastic opportunity to brush up your English language skills in preparation for taking the GCSE English or Access to HE courses next year. Improve your spelling, punctuation and grammar; develop your reading skills; and polish up your presentation skills with this intensive course. This course is condensed into a 6 week period and learners need to be at Level 1 to enrol (a longer course will be available in the new academic year, if preferred) *Tutor: Bernadette Hall*

Maths Level 2 – Functional Skills (OCR)

Functional Skills Maths helps you to develop a wide range of maths skills including number, decimals, fractions, measurement, area, volume and data collection/analysis. This course is condensed into a 6 week period and learners need to be at Level 1 to enrol (a longer course will be available in the new academic year, if preferred) *Tutor: Mark Raisborough*
