Snap shots of our learning!

Foundation – Children have been experimenting with breathing ‘smoke’ like a dragon as they have been outside in the cold watching ice defrost, and will be continuing their investigations by seeing whether they can always do this in any environment. They have been reading ‘Owl Babies’ by Martin Waddle and learning about the unique features of these beautiful birds such as talons.

Class One – Class 1 have been enjoying their new class book ‘George’s Marvellous Medicine’ and have been describing the character of Granny. Year 1 have been counting beyond 10 and changing patterns and Y2 have been learning the value of the differing coins and notes of British money. They have also been exploring school, comparing sounds in different locations.

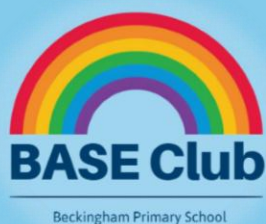
Class Two – Class 2 have been immersed in a film unit called ‘Treasure’ deciphering riddles about different artefacts and comparing what treasure means to different people. They have begun an investigation in Science to solve a ‘Whodunit’ using their understanding of light and have been comparing tints and shades in art.

Class Three – This week, Class 3 have been making predictions about what will happen next in their new class novel ‘Holes’ by Louis Sachar (one of Mrs Furniss’ all-time favourites!). They have been comparing English and American English vocabulary such as sneakers/trainers, center/centre and have been introduced to the yellow-spotted lizards who reside at Camp Green Lake in Texas! They have also been busy adding and subtracting fractions and have started learning about photomontages in art.
