Ensuring Every Child at Beckingham THRIVES

We are pleased that next year we will be rolling out the Thrive programme across school. This is an evidence-backed approach to behaviour, attendance and well-being and has an evidence-based, positive impact on the learning outcomes of pupils across schools who embed the approach.

The curriculum remains the same, but the approach of deeply understanding the needs of each individual child allow support to be offered to improve the well-being of all. We will be offering more information as we start our Thrive journey in the new academic year, and a review of our Behaviour Policy, along with the rewards system in school will follow. Our student council has been consulted about initial changes to the rewards policy and have given their seal of approval to a refresh of the THRIVES values in school to reflect values they wish to underpin our school.

From September, the new THRIVES values will be:



These were chosen by the school council to be understandable for children from Foundation onwards and will be key in our approach to our conversations with pupils regarding their learning behaviours and those they display in their life beyond the school grounds.

They were eager to give the opportunity for the older children to still collect the original set of THRIVES values if they wished as they have less time in school, and this will be an option when awards are given to allow a transition period.

We hope you are as excited as we are to embrace the new values and the school council would value any thoughts you may have via office@beckingham.notts.sch.uk as they increase their role in moving our school forward.

Building updates

Over the summer, we are having a hygiene suite fitted in the old building by Notts CC, coinciding with repairs to water pipes, to ensure we have fully accessible facilities for the children, staff and visitors.

We will be following up this work with the installation of a second hygiene suite in the main building, with work commencing at a date as yet unconfirmed by Notts CC, but anticipated to be early in the Autumn term. To facilitate this, a new entrance door will be also be fitted in Class 1 allowing access to the wild area, and the external door in the library moved further up towards the offices. More details will follow when we have them, but we are pleased that our school will then be fully accessible to all, reflecting our commitment to inclusion.

Safeguarding in the holidays

What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding ensures that every child, regardless of their age, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex, or sexual orientation, has a right to equal protection from harm. It's the steps that people take to protect children and vulnerable people from harm.



Examples of safeguarding concerns to look out for:



Physical

A group of children pushing or hitting a smaller child when an adult isn't looking.



Emotional

A crying child running towards their parent who responds in a harsh manner using inappropriate language.



Sexual

A teenage girl walking home being catcalled and harassed, or being touched without consent.



Neglect

A child wearing the same dirty clothes every day and stealing food from other children.



How can you help?

If you ever see anything happen to a child that makes you feel uncomfortable, please let your safeguarding lead / person know. You're are not causing problems - you could save a child from unnecessary harm.

Any one of these things might not mean anything, but if your safeguarding lead / person isn't told, then they can't help.

In term-time, the person to contact would be within school, but during the holidays, emails are only monitored periodically, including the safeguarding email address

If a child is in immediate danger, please call 999 and report to the police. If you have safeguarding concerns that are not likely to put a child in immediate danger you can report it (anonymously if required) via 0300 5008080 – the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH)
