This week in school we focused on our value of Honesty and the value of telling the truth.



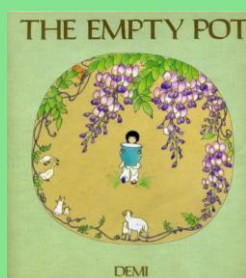
Honesty

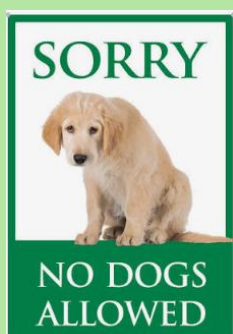
A polite reminder

Save the environment one step at a time!

We take part in the Living Streets Walk to School Challenge, where we encourage children to walk, scoot, bike or wheel to school as often as they can.

Everyday, trips are recorded on a class site, and children earn badges for walking to school twice a week or more in a month! The badges are made of recycled plastic and any spares are recycled to make new badges, and it is a great way to feel part of the team helping to make Beckingham village that little bit greener.

If cars are a necessary part of your journey, park on High Street and stride down The Limes, or anywhere that involves walking at least a short distance to reduce traffic congestion around school – Park and Stride journeys also count as active ones!
